## Special Congregational Meeting

There will be a Special Congregational Meeting on November 12 to determine if a call will be issued to Spencer Steele as Associate Pastor of The Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit. Spencer has been interviewed and unanimously recommended to the congregation for consideration by the Call Committee and the Congregation Council. Spencer currently lives in Capistrano Beach, California. He is a graduate of California Lutheran University and also Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary. He also has experience working with children and youth at Lutheran Retreats, Camps and Conferences (LRCC) in California. He is married to Amanda, an interior designer.

On **Saturday, November 11** from 4:00 to 6:00 pm, there will be a "Meet and Greet" at Holy Spirit in the Fellowship Center where you can informally meet Spencer and Amanda. Then on **Sunday November 12**, Spencer will serve as the preacher for all three Sunday Services. A representative from the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod will be present to conduct a congregational meeting and vote that morning. The meeting will be convened following the 7:30 am service and then recessed. It will be reconvened following the 8:45 am service and again recessed to be reconvened at the conclusion of the 10:45 am service. The meeting will be adjourned with the completion of business following the third service and all votes will be tallied at that point.

During the congregational meeting, members of Holy Spirit will be asked to vote on two motions and to reply in the affirmative or negative (Yes or No) to each. Please be aware that both motions are unanimously recommended by the Call Committee and Congregation Council. The salary and benefit package has been approved by the Bishop of our synod.

We hope you will make every effort to attend these important events and join us as together we move forward in ministry in Jesus' name.





## Great News from Bear Creek Camp

We are pleased to share that our summer camp attendance continues to rise. For the first time in over 20 years, we have seen camper attendance increase five years in a row.

- 1,093 campers attended in 2017, a 14% increase over 2016 and a 73% increase since 2012
- 13 Day Camps- counselor teams visited congregations in PA synods
- 160 kids from the local Wilkes-Barre community attended the Nature Day Camp program.

Our summer theme, "Restored", shared with our campers the countless ways God is restoring each of us, every single day. Thank you for supporting Bear Creek Camp!

## September 2017 Financial Results and Discussion

**Operating Performance:** September, as anticipated, was not a strong month on the revenue side. Revenues totaled \$52,972 while expenses were \$56,289, giving us a deficit of \$3,317. We had budgeted a deficit of \$6,529.



We ran a deficit mainly because revenues were \$3,224 less than plan. Pledged revenue was \$3,911 under budget. Unpledged revenue was \$358 over budget.

Overall expenses were under budget by \$6,436. Approximately \$4,000 were savings from the Director of Youth salary and benefits. Most mission areas were close or slightly under budget with the exception of Staff Relations. Staff Relations was \$1,136 over budget due mainly to expenses stemming from the search for a new Associate Pastor. Resources for Ministry came in \$1,342 under budget due to savings in service contracts, service agreements and the electricity bill.

Year-to-date, we have a surplus of \$39,727 vs. a budgeted surplus of \$3,522. The strong revenue in the previous months have helped to keep us ahead of budget year-to-date. Some of the surplus is due to timing from pledges that have been paid in advance.

**Available Operating Cash:** We ended the month with an available cash balance for operations of \$107,765, down \$3,274 from August.

**Building Fund:** The balance in the fund increased slightly during the month to \$12,130.

**Available Capital Campaign Cash:** Our available cash balance in the Capital Campaign Fund increased slightly to \$52,981. The balance in this fund increased by \$1,708 from donations. There were no expenditures this month.

### Grief Support Group

Grief demands the support and compassion of fellow human beings, and grief support groups provide an opportunity for this kind of help. Having a support group for grieving individuals is also an extension of Christ's ministry and a fulfillment of His promise, *"Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted."*



A Bereavement Support Group, for those who have lost a loved one, will begin here at Holy Spirit on January 18th. Our group will meet for ten weeks from 4:00 pm until 5:30 pm. ### Looking Ahead – Facility Concerns

In recent weeks the Council and particularly the Property and Finance Teams have been discussing and looking toward the future needs of our church facilities. The Property team has been developing a five year maintenance and enhancement plan and Finance has undertaken investigating how to finance the projects. There have been significant concerns about the sanctuary HVAC system and breakdowns, air quality and cost of repairs.

To that end, the Council along with the Property and Finance Teams have engaged Kirby Smith Associates to help us assess how best to financially address the various needs we see in the future. Members of our congregation are being surveyed to help us see the future needs more clearly. A detailed plan will be shared at the Annual Meeting. ~Pr. Ric

*The Lord Bless You and Keep You* by John Rutter





## Prepare Room in Your Heart for the Birth of Jesus

"...And Mary gave birth to her son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." (Luke 2:7)

As we prepare for Christmas, we may want to think more deeply about creating a room for the greatest gift of Christmas to be delivered. We need to be sure we don't say, "Jesus, I don't have room for you." Because if we fill our mind, our actions, and our hearts with other things, we will have a big sign on our hearts that lights, "no vacancy." We have to slow down and clear out some of the clutter and busyness of our holiday preparations to make room for Jesus; open the doors of our soul and say, "Yes, Lord, we have room"; and look him in the eyes and say, "You are the preferred guest in my heart."

Making room for Jesus means we:

Pray and ask Jesus to make himself present in our hearts.

Acknowledge to God that we tend to stray.

Keep our eyes focused on the word of the Lord.

Meditate on the story of Christmas and the gift called Jesus

Repent of any idols we are putting before the Lord.

Let go of worries, anxieties and busyness to find Christ.

Find joy in the grace and glory that Christ brings.
