### Stepping Into 2020

As 2019 comes to close, I wanted to share a few thoughts about what's next for Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit. Let's look at what's new as we step into 2020.

The congregation voted positively on December 8 (303 for and 1 against) to call Tami Reichley as our Associate Pastor for Pastoral Care and Outreach. This allows us to continue and expand on the ministries in the areas of Stephen Ministry, Eucharistic Ministry, visitation and community evangelism and outreach. Tami's Service of Ordination and Installation has been scheduled for Feb 16 at 4pm. Save the date!

Our Annual Congregational Meeting is scheduled for February 2 immediately following the 10:45 worship service and light luncheon. The agenda includes the usual business of adopting a budget for 2020 and electing Council members and Synod Assembly delegates, but also will include a recommendation concerning the next steps of our "Spirit Led -Spirit Alive" Campaign. We have a proposed expansion and renovation plan from Funk Construction which is currently under review by our Mission Teams and Council. A formal recommendation is expected for consideration at the Annual Meeting. There will be a Council Forum held during the Center for Faith and Life hour on Sunday, January 26th where the budget, nominees and building plans will be State-of-the-Church reviewed. Please plan to attend.

As we begin the new year, I want you to be aware that Council has been actively engaged in considering how best to make our facilities as safe as possible. We have met with the Pennsylvania State Police who audited our building for safety and threat concerns. We have formed an Action Team to begin to evaluate that report and begin to implement features to ensure safety and protect our members as best we can.

As we end 2019, we are hoping to end the year once again in a strong financial position. We won't be certain until December 31, but trends look good to end the year in a positive cash balance despite having adopted a deficit budget. Please make every effort to fulfill your commitments for 2019 so that we can enter 2020 with the financial strength we will need to meet a challenging budget for 2020.

Finally, we ask your prayers as we move forward. During a time when many congregations are shrinking and struggling, we continue to experience energy, strength and vision of the future. Your prayers, commitment and financial support make the difference. Help us step into 2020 with passion and faith in our Lord and Savior.





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## Church News...

#### November 2019 Financial Results and Discussion

**Operating Performance**: November net income turned out to be higher than what was expected (-\$4,191 vs. -\$6,040 expected). Expenses were \$2,755 lower than expected (\$62,989) and income was \$906 lower than expected (\$58,798). Most mission areas were close or under budget. Though we finished the month with a deficit, we are still ahead of our YTD deficit. At this point, Faith Formation for Youth is the mission area most under budget YTD with \$3,677 actual versus \$7,603 budgeted.



Thrivent totals were \$464 while we had budgeted \$0.

**Projected vs. Budgeted Cash Balance**: At this point it looks like we will end the year with a cash balance of \$122,893. We thought we'd have a cash balance of \$95,754.

**Spirit Led, Spirit Alive Capital Campaign Cash**: The current total in our Spirit Led, Spirit Alive account is \$155,352. Total donations for the month of November (including transfers) were \$91,163. Please note we transferred all funds from the previous Capital Campaign account to the new Spirit Led, Spirit Alive account. I will report on this account only moving forward.

**HVAC System**: The balance on our Mission Investment Fund loan for the HVAC system is \$123,030.

**Building Fund**: Our building fund decreased to \$9,148 due to an expense for \$7,350 for an HVAC system replacement for the office. Donations totaled \$3,157 for the month of November. Thank you for your continued support of our Building Fund!

## Our Church, Our Community, and Our World...

#### News from The Plaster House, Tanzania

To those of us living in developed countries, it's inconceivable that the legs of our children could weaken and bend because of the drinking water. Sadly, it happens every day in the Rift Valley of Africa, because the landform of the Rift Valley has a high level of fluoride which leaches into the ground water. People take the water from wells and bores to be used for drinking and cooking. Fluoride levels in water up to 1.5 parts per million are safe, even beneficial to people. Above that level fluoride is dangerous, as the excess fluoride in the water weakens the bones of children. As they grow and their bodies carry more weight the bones bend. The condition is called skeletal fluorosis.

Right now, three-year-old Fortunatus is being treated at The Plaster House for fluorosis. Fortunatus' family lives in a village near Katavi on Lake Tanganyika, close to the Democratic Republic of the Congo. When the Plaster House outreach team visited their village a few months ago, Fortunatus' mother sought help for her son. With support from the Nomad Trust he has been able to travel to Arusha and he is scheduled for surgery to straighten his legs and set him on a new path through life. Thanks to the generosity of donors and surgeons and the skilled and loving care at The Plaster House, Fortunatus will soon be able to run with his friends after surgery to straighten his legs.

It only costs \$28 to support a child like Fortunatus for a week. Holy Spirit's Shelter for the Savior drive continues through January 26th, when we celebrate Global Mission Sunday and dedicate this season's donations for Plaster House. Please look for the Shelter for the Savior tree in the narthex.


