### From "STILLBORN" TO "NEWBORN"

For many years in Tanzania, a baby that was born at 28 weeks or less was called a "stillborn". That meant that if the baby was born with complications (likely more often than not), no real attempt was made to save the child. Arusha Lutheran Medical Center staff were not satisfied with that approach. So, they developed a NICU to fight for the survival of preemies. They have been very successful, so that there are many "stillborn" babies walking about in the Arusha area.\*

What do Dr. Swanson and his staff need from us? Prayers for their continued success, for sure. ### \*SOMETHING NEW AND EXCITING IS HAPPENING AT HOLY SPIRIT\*

On March 1, 2023, the Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit is **adopting an apartment** at the Sixth Street Shelter. The Sixth Street Shelter was started by Community Action in downtown Allentown in 1984. The Sixth Street Shelter offers 25 apartments to homeless families. It is the only shelter in the Lehigh Valley to offer families the privacy and security of a furnished apartment with a complete kitchen.

The **Adopt-An-Apartment** program was created to meet the upkeep, household supplies, and decorative needs of a homeless shelter apartment. Each apartment houses on average six families—with children—every year. The Adopt-An-Apartment program will pair us with an apartment for 12 months

Throughout the year, we will help with the apartment's upkeep such as painting and "spring cleaning". We will also provide apartment supplies such as bedding, housewares and cleaning supplies. Most families stay six weeks to 3 months. The family can keep the apartment's household supplies to start a new life in a new residence when they leave the homeless shelter.

We will be looking for people to help clean, paint, donate new and used living supplies and decorate the apartment. The apartment can turn over in a few days. We are looking for individuals, families and youth to help on short notice to carry supplies and spruce up the apartment.

**Christmas Ingathering** – The NEPA Synod Lehigh Mission District **Christmas Ingathering** program for 2022 was a smashing success due to your generous and abundant giving! For the Sharing Life program sponsored by St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Allentown, we collected **323 items** which included toothbrushes, Chapstick, mittens, socks, deodorant, winter beanies, and packs of gum and mints. For the Bright Hope Pregnancy center, we collected **150 items**, including **700+ diapers**.

For the children in the foster care program at the Lutheran Home at Topton, we collected **65 gifts**.
