## \*ADOPT-AN-APARTMENT\*



As mentioned in the January newsletter, the Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit is **adopting an apartment at the Sixth Street Shelter** in March. We are collecting **specific new** items in February to prepare our apartment for a new family. Additionally, we will need volunteers to help prepare the apartment for the new family, e.g. do light repairs, paint and/or clean. The apartment can turn over in a few days. So we are looking for individuals, families and youth, to help on short notice to carry/transport supplies and spruce up the apartment.

The Sixth Street Shelter was started by Community Action in downtown Allentown in 1984 and offers 25 apartments to homeless families. It is the only shelter in the Lehigh Valley to offer families the privacy and security of a furnished apartment with a complete kitchen for 30 - 90 days. When a family leaves the shelter, they are permitted to take the items LCHS provided to their new home.

We are currently collecting in order to set up the apartment for the first family. Once this is completed, we expect to do a Spring and Fall collection to gather specific new items so we can prepare the apartment for each new family for 12 months.

## \*ELCA WORLD HUNGER APPEAL\*

During this Lenten Season we will be focusing on support of the ELCA World Hunger effort.

Over 821 million people in the world, 11% of the world's population, are hungry. In the United States alone over 40 million people are unsure where their next meal is coming from.

The ELCA World Hunger program is making a difference around the world. Ending hunger is about more than just providing food; it is about providing a road to long-term sustainability and change. The ELCA is actively involved in:

Connecting people with the resources they need to produce food and gain access to clean water. Provide education, health care and sources of income to bring about long-term sustainability.

In 2017, ELCA World Hunger support topped \$21.3 million in aid. The ELCA World Hunger program is active in 62 countries in the world including the United States.
