ALLENTOWN 6TH SHELTER ADOPT-AN-APARTMENT

LCHS adopted a Sixth Street Shelter Apartment in March. We started our second collection of specific new items in April which will continue to May 15th. This collection will help prepare our apartment for three new families throughout 2023. JON SATROM CONCERT HEARTS FOR HAITI AND 6TH STREET SHELTER

The Jon Satrom concert on May 6^{th} at 4pm in our church Worship Center will include a free will offering split 50/50 for Hearts for Haiti and the 6^{th} Street Shelter.

Hearts for Haiti is a public charity, non-profit 501(c)3 organization founded in 2001 by Jill Jarrett, a member of LCHS, and Eva Stephens. The organization promises that 100% of all monetary donations go directly to the most immediate needs of the babies and children living in the BRESMA orphanage in Port Au Prince, Haiti. These needs include formula, milk, water, food and diapers. The founders and friends sponsor all administrative expenses.

The humanitarian crisis in Haiti is beyond devastating. Horrific gang violence added to the long existing extreme poverty is having an unfathomably disastrous impact on everyone in Haiti, especially children who are the most vulnerable. One third of children are in urgent need of emergency assistance. For most, the only hope resides in aid from organizations like Hearts for Haiti.

The Sixth Street Shelter, a member of Community Action Lehigh Valley, is located in Center City Allentown. It provides safe, short-term housing for families of any configuration. Their 18-24 month transitional housing programs make it possible for parents to pursue educational or vocational training while working towards self-sufficiency for themselves and their families.

LUTHERAN DAY AT THE CAPITOL

For "what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?" Micah 6:8

On April 27th Lutherans from around Pennsylvania (including LCHS's Liz Moessner, Dean Black, and John Mosovsky) met at the Capitol for inspiration, learning and advocacy. Taking Micah 6:8 as a starting point, we focused on how we as Lutheran Christians understand our call to live together as God's faithful people and to strive for justice and peace in the context of today's debates over the role of faith in public life. At Trinity Lutheran Church, Camp Hill, we attended workshops on food, housing, LGBTQ+ rights in PA, and faith in civic life. We celebrated outstanding advocates during lunch, attended worship, and then boarded a shuttle to the Capitol to meet with our elected legislators.

A keynote address, "Discipleship in a Democracy: Sorting out a Lutheran View" was given by Rev. Dr. Roger Willer, ELCA Director for Theological Ethics. Dr. Willer focused on maintaining an institutional separation of church and state with a functional interaction of our responsibility (403.n of the ELCA Constitution) to call government to account for God's intention of a flourishing society. In other words, working with civil authorities in areas of mutual endeavors by supporting the best for the common good AND expressing the tension of our dual citizenship in the eternal and temporal realms of God not as self-righteous dominance (Christian Nationalism) but as a humble motivation to love one another.

Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania (LAMPa) organized Lutheran Day at the Capitol and will be celebrating its 45th Anniversary next year with a similar event on May 9, 2024.
