Neonatal intensive care — a means of survival for very ill babies. In Tanzania, neonatal diseases remain the #1 cause of death, resulting in more annual deaths than any other disease or condition. While that is hard to believe, the good news is you can help change that statistic. For the Advent to Epiphany period (**November 26 through January 21**), Holy Spirit will be **fundraising for the NICU** at Arusha Lutheran Medical Center. To save the lives of pre-term and critically ill babies, the NICU focuses on innovative, low-cost, low-tech care. Last year, the NICU treated about 350 children, with an average stay of 19 days each,

for a total cost of \$250k. The entire annual budget for all the free and subsidized care at the NICU is equivalent to the cost of treating just <u>one</u> critically ill baby in a US NICU for three weeks. And the Arusha NICU's survival rate is over 92%. That outcome is the highest in Tanzania and among the best in Africa.

Going beyond day-to-day life-saving work, the Arusha NICU is offering neonatal-care training to Tanzanian nurses and doctors, and it also sponsors an annual Neonatology Conference to share the best care techniques among hundreds of attendees from many African countries. That means more babies' lives saved across the whole continent because of what starts in Arusha.

We'll be giving you more information in Holy Happenings over the next few weeks and in the December Outreach Newsletter on how you can participate in this appeal. In the meantime, just think about this: to save a baby's life - a cost to donors of less than \$70 per neonate day or less than \$1,000 for a neonate's entire stay.





OUTREACH ACTIVITIES SUMMARIES

Kafika House - Transforming Childhood

On Sunday October 22nd, Sarah Rejman visited Holy Spirit as part of a short visit to the USA from her duties in Tanzania. Sarah is the Director of Kafika House, as she was for its predecessor, the Plaster House. She gave a short temple talk at the early and late services and "wowed" the audience in the Fellowship Center as she described the expansion of the treatment facilities over the past few years and the plans for further expansion over the next few years.







Kafika House now has two facilities and is preparing to open a third facility for treating children with correctable disabilities. About 1200 children are treated each year now, with expansion plans to treat up to 3000 children a year. Presurgery strengthening, surgery, and post-surgical recovery and rehabilitation cost about \$1000 per child and take up to 90 days of care. Holy Spirit members have contributed to Plaster House in the past and look forward to sending children back to their communities in the future, whole and full of hope.
