Sixth Street Shelter and Allentown Rescue Mission

We begin our annual drive to support these local non-profit organizations that devote resources to families in need and homeless men. The Eastern Pennsylvania Continuums of Care's Point in Time (PIT) Count of individuals experiencing homelessness in January 2023 was 2,024. Previous PIT counts reported roughly two-thirds of this number represented individuals in Allentown.

ELCA World Hunger Appeal



During this Lenten Season we are focusing our support on the ELCA World Hunger effort.

Over 821 million people in the world, 11% of the world's population, are hungry. In the United States alone over 40 million people are unsure where their next meal is coming from.

The ELCA World Hunger program is making a difference around the world. Ending hunger is about more than just providing food; it is about providing a road to long-term sustainability and change. The ELCA is actively involved in: Connecting people with the resources they need to

produce food and gain access to clean water. Provide education, health care and sources of income to bring about long-term sustainability.

In 2019, ELCA World Hunger support topped \$23 million in aid. The ELCA World Hunger program is active in 62 countries in the world including the United States. Projects supported by the ELCA World Hunger program include:

Establishing health clinics

Providing micro loans

Building water wells

Establishing animal husbandry programs

Providing community meals

Establishing advocacy programs to influence country and local governments

The ELCA World Hunger programs provides valuable assistance around the globe. This program depends on financial support from ELCA congregations like Holy Spirit. We can help support these efforts during this Lenten season. Matthew 25:35 states this best; "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in."

Here are the various ways you can donate:

- Use your weekly offering envelope by entering "World Hunger" and your donation amount on the Special Gifts line or use the special Lenten Offering envelope, contributions to which will go to World Hunger this year.

Our Lenten collection from February 11th – March 24th will be monetary donations for God's Global Barnyard, an ELCA World Hunger initiative. The program is designed to break the cycle of hunger and poverty by providing animals to families in need. The Sunday School children will receive a barn bank to fill with coins, paper money and checks. A donation of just \$10 provides for the purchase of chicks. Spring Mission Trip


Adult Volunteers Needed!

Sunday School Outreach



Our Sunday School and preschool students recently collected toothbrushes and toothpaste for children in the Allentown School District. A total of 272 toothbrushes and 186 tubes of toothpaste were donated. Thank you for your generous hearts!

SPOT LIGHT on ALLENTOWN RESCUE MISSION

The Allentown Rescue Mission has been a benevolence partner of our congregation for many years. We support their goals to rescue, rehabilitate, and restore homeless men. Our support includes monetary benevolence as well as in-kind collections such as the one highlighted above for the month of March. The Rescue Mission is a non-denominational, social services organization that provides critically-needed goods and services to homeless men regardless of race, color, creed, national origin, sexual orientation, or religion. They have been helping those less fortunate for over 100 years!

A review of our social ministry archives found a November 1990 issue of *A Resting Place*, a publication of the Rescue Mission. An article titled "Homeless on Thanksgiving" asked these two questions, "Are the homeless of the Allentown Rescue Mission thankful? Or are they bitter, sad, and lonely?" Here were some responses when asked "What are you thankful for?"

"I am thankful for the Bible."

"I'm thankful for the place here, and what the people have done for me.

I'm thankful for my job."

"I am thankful that I have a place to stay and 3 square meals a day.

That may sound corny but it's the truth."

"I am thankful for being alive. Every day I get up; I'm thankful for that."

"I am thankful for having the Mission and a place to eat and sleep, and having clothes."

The Apostle Paul wrote, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)
