A new opportunity for Holy Spirit and the Lehigh Mission District



The Lehigh Mission District is requesting donations for a Summer Ingathering project this summer, a new opportunity to help meet the needs of our sister congregation, Holy Trinity Lutheran in Catasauqua. During the month of April, we will be collecting items to support the summer lunch program at Holy Trinity Lutheran in Catasauqua. *They provide free lunches in a local park to feed and support the children attending their community program during the summer months.*

- 16oz water bottles
- Walmart gift cards in \$10.00 increments (any amount for Holy Trinity to buy needed supplies for the summer program).

## Church Community Garden

- Straw mulch has been removed from the existing raised beds and we are letting soil dry out a bit before prepping it for planting
- Our garden is growing! We received approval for 2 additional raised beds. There is one new raised bed frame in the Lower Level outside storage room, and one additional frame will be purchased.
- We have received approval of the Community Garden effort as a Thrivent Action Team and we will be receiving a \$250 gift credit card to be used to acquire the second new raised bed frame and other plant materials/stock
- Garlic planted in the fall has wintered well and will be harvested in mid-summer. First spring crops will be onions, radishes and salad mix. Peppers, eggplant, and perhaps beans likely to follow later.

This year Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania (LAMPa) has scheduled its day in the capitol on May 9<sup>th</sup> and will be marking their 45<sup>th</sup> anniversary along with ELCA's World Hunger's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Quite a legacy of community building and justice seeking! It will be a day of inspiration, learning, and advocacy with workshops, speakers, worship service, and visits with our legislators. And if you wish, there's an evening gala of dinner and celebration at the Hilton Downtown Harrisburg which begins with a social hour at 5:30PM.

The event starts at Trinity Lutheran Church in Camp Hill and includes transportation to the Pennsylvania State Capitol. Check-in begins at 8:30AM and the day concludes at 4:30PM.
