Financial Results and Discussion First Quarter Ending March 2024

<u>Income:</u> Income for the 1st quarter is about 2% below projections/budget. Most of the income shortfall is actual revenue for individuals providing "estimates of giving" being less than the estimates that were provided. We continue to have a number of members fulfill their annual estimate of giving at the beginning of the year, which is a great help to operational cash flow.

Expenses: Expenses for the 1st quarter were higher than projected/budgeted. The Resources for Ministry expense line includes all our service contracts, energy bills and building maintenance. Higher expenses than projected during Q1 were driven in part by snow removal, roof repairs from significant rain events and the timing of some annual service contract payments being different than budgeted.

Summary

While we have added \$15,851 to our operating reserve during the first quarter, this amount is only about half of what we expected to add to our operating reserve during the quarter. It is critical that we continue to increase our operating reserve (income exceeding expenses) during the 2nd and 3rd quarters of the calendar year to fund our budgeted benevolence and other operating expenses which will occur during the 4th quarter.
