Hello Holy Spirit!

Fall has arrived, and Angel Network is gearing up for our Food Basket Give-a-Ways December 8th -11th 2024, and April 5th - 9th of 2025. If you remember, last year we did this collection only in October and we thought it would be a challenge to get everything we needed for both winter and spring in one

collection. But thanks to all of you it was easy-peasy! The "one-time" collection worked, (we only needed to fill in with detergent in the spring), and as always, we made all of our collection goals! You are all so generous in helping the Emmaus High School students and their families! We could not do this without you!

This year we will again be collecting canned corn and canned green beans or peas, and laundry detergent or laundry pods. We are starting with 38 laundry detergents, 110 cans of corn, and 96 cans of green beans. The green beans/peas have already been donated by some generous congregants! So that goal is already met!! Thank-you! Our collection during the month of October, supported by the Family Worship Service and Sunday School is:

- Detergent 272 bottles or bags (laundry pods)
- Corn 200 cans of corn

A few reminders - Any grocery store will be happy to provide you with a case of corn - they usually come in 4, 8, and 12 cans to a case, and **are much easier to carry!** You may need to give them a heads up and come back for it, but most of the time they can accommodate you.

Many of you have contacted me about donating used clothing or other items. Here's how to help with that. We only accept <u>STUDENT</u> clothing in new or very good condition.

Produce deliveries are winding down. Lettuce/salad greens have been recently planted and garlic will be planted in mid-October for harvesting in July 2025. Salad greens, peppers, Brussel sprouts, eggplants, and zucchinis were delivered to the Grace Lutheran Church Food Cupboard.

Pastor Tami recently visited the Food Cupboard to better understand organization and how we might assist in other ways over the winter months. The food cupboard serves 60-70 families every week. They also receive fresh produce from a local farmer and weekly food donations from Weis in Emmaus. Thanks to the garden team

volunteers for ongoing help with this ministry, and thanks to congregation members who have donated produce from their home gardens for the food bank.!
