CHANGE IN WORSHIP TIMES STARTING FEBRUARY 2ND

The staff has been busy reviewing and

making recommendations to the Council from the Worship Survey that was conducted in the middle of 2024. We heard and took seriously what you expressed about your worship experience here at Holy Spirit.

At the December Council meeting, a motion was made and passed to act on the following recommendations. We have included what we hope to accomplish with these changes.

> Worship times will change to the following on Sunday, February 2nd 8:30 Worship, <u>9:45</u> Family Worship, <u>10:45</u> Worship

What we hope to provide with the 15-minute change for our 2nd and 3rd Sunday morning worships: 8:30 worship to not feel rushed. Following 8:30 worship, plenty of time for pastor/member/visitor conversations. Allowing Altar Care and Production team time to prepare for the next worship. And adequate time for checking in with family worship leadership for the day.

Please note that starting on February 2nd, Faith Formation will begin at 9:45 for **Cat Class**, **Youth and Coffee-Tea-Connect**. The **Sunday School** time will follow the Family Worship, as is presently happening.

Along with this change we will also be moving the **Gospel/Sermon replay** into the All Saints Room. Through this change, we will be able to provide this opportunity every Sunday. This will free the worship space for any worship, music and program rehearsals that need to take place throughout the year.



Financial Results and Discussion – December 2024

Operating Performance: December's income was \$122,403, \$15,726 or 14.74% above budget, which we primarily attribute to members increasing their financial gifts in response to the Stepping Up 2025 stewardship campaign. Operating expenses were \$93,528, \$7,761 or 7.66% below budget. We finished December with a \$28,875 surplus, compared to a budgeted surplus of \$5,388. The graph below presents our operating cash balance shown against our monthly cash requirement July- December.

Thank you to everyone that continues to share their financial gifts in support of our ministries!

- Straight Line at \$70,000: Represents our monthly cash requirement to operate the church.
- Upper Straight Line: Represents our current operating cash balance at the end of each month.



Building Fund:

The building fund decreased \$2,745.74 during the month and has a balance of \$1,881.44.

Mortgage Update:

The mortgage balance as of December 31, 2024 is \$367,881.5.
