Fundraising for Tanzania

Support those Tanzanian ministries we have grown to know and love and new programs we plan to visit. Twelve LCHS members and friends will be traveling to Tanzania in spring 2025 to visit and learn from our ministries in that African country. During this summer the Outreach and Global Missions teams and our travelers are collecting donations to be distributed (100%) to the charities which Holy Spirit has been supporting. Remember that those donations can make a huge difference in the lives of many of our brothers and sisters in Christ in Tanzania. You know a number of those ministries, including:

- (a) Kafika House (previously Plaster House), which provides pre- and post-operative care for children with correctible disabilities. Over 1200 children can be treated every year and sent home to their families with new abilities and hope.
- (b) Olchoki Elementary School, a school with limited resources that provides educational opportunities for children while providing at least one meal a day.
- (c) The Arusha and Selian Lutheran Hospitals, whose numerous healthcare ministries include Neonatal Intensive Care Units, each of which has a remarkable survival rate for these vulnerable infants while also providing care for their mothers.
- (d) The MaaSAE Girls Lutheran Secondary School, which provides the opportunity for middle- and high-school education for the daughters of the Maasai and other seminomadic people of Tanzania.

(e) The ALMC School of Nursing, which helps to meet the great need for nurses in Tanzania.

In this newsletter article, we wish to introduce you to three other programs in the Arusha area of Tanzania:



Ilboru Special Needs School

One of the first schools in Tanzania to educate students with special needs. Three categories of students are the deaf, the blind, and those who struggle with other learning differences. Started in basically a broom closet, the school now has multiple classrooms and even a small dormitory so that students do not need to undergo the potentially hazardous conditions of traveling to and from their villages.



Tumaini University at Makumira

The university was founded in 1997 as the Lutheran Theological College Makumira by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT). The university remains affiliated with the ELCT and includes among its many programs the Bachelor of Divinity and Master of Theology degrees, and a Bachelor of Arts in Music degree focusing on church musicians.



Empowered Girls

A relatively new program that equips, enlightens, and empowers girls in Tanzania. Seminars teach life skills and health, and fun activities help to build confidence. **How to Make Donations:** (a) take a decorated envelope in the Nave and return it with either a check or cash with your LCHS offering, notating it for "Tanzanian Ministries", or (b) donate online through the LCHS website at LCHSEmmaus.org, choosing "Tanzania Ministries" from the drop-down menu, under the Give/Donate button, or (c) mail your donation to Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit, 3461 S. Cedar Crest Blvd. Emmaus, PA 18049, notating that the donation is for Tanzania Ministries. All contributions are fully tax deductible as allowed by law.

God's Work Our Hands



This is a great opportunity to help various local community organizations working side by side with fellow Holy Spirit members. Church Community Garden Update



- The produce harvested in the last month and delivered to the food bank at Grace Lutheran Church in Macungie includes 11 eggplants, 35 peppers, 80 garlic bulbs, 50 onions, 10 cucumbers, and several packages of sage.
- Green beans have been planted, along with zucchini, which should be ready for harvest in about 50 days. Tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, and brussel sprouts are growing well.
- In a few weeks fall crops can be planted, such as cabbage, kale, spinach, beets, or radishes.
- Thanks to the garden team volunteers for ongoing help with this ministry, and thanks to congregation members who have donated produce from their home gardens for the food bank.!
