March 9 - Children's Needs in LV Foster Care

Maria Samaritano will be speaking at Coffee, Tea & Connect on Sunday, March 9th. Come to hear more about the amazing work Maria is doing in Lehigh & Northampton Counties to help foster families as well as families at risk of losing their children to foster care. Do you know what the primary reason children end up in foster care? It's not abuse. It's poverty. Poverty creates a situation where parents cannot adequately provide necessities for their children. Maria generously gives of her time to coordinate with the county case workers and various individuals and organizations throughout the Lehigh Valley to collect items (new and gently used) to help families. She issues a detailed newsletter each week, typically on Thursdays, identifying the needs. You can sign-up to donate via a link to Signup Genius in the outreach newsletter. Maria coordinates with those donating to collect the items and deliver to the case workers.

be from an agency or organization you know, say there is a problem or offer a prize. The pressure is put on to act now. Be aware of odd ways of paying, for example, gift cards or cryptocurrency. Scammers can be very persuasive and may use aggressive tactics to convince you that their call is legitimate. If you receive a suspicious call, remember to stay calm and HANG UP immediately. Do not engage with the caller or provide any personal information.

Volunteers choose what days they would like to serve, and training is available. You can also **call the church office** if you are interested in volunteering and Nikki will add you to the list.


THRIVENT CHOICE DOLLARS
