Blood Drive

Prepare to donate! Join LCHS and Miller-Keystone Blood Center in donating your blood to save lives. Holy Spirit is looking to host a blood drive sometime hopefully in July. Before securing a firm date, Miller-Keystone requests that we, as a congregation, show that there is enough interest in an on-site blood drive. Miller-Keystone Blood Center requires an interest list of 25 people to get started. Please note that your "signing up" as interested in donating does not mean that you are firmly committed – it is simply a requirement of the blood center to show enough interest for them to provide the resources of an on-site blood mobile. This list requests your name, phone number, and email address. If there is sufficient interest, a date for the drive will be scheduled. ELCA World Hunger Appeal

During this Lenten Season we will be supporting the ELCA World Hunger effort. Over 821 million people in the world, 11% of the world's population, are hungry. In the United States alone over 40 million people are unsure where their next meal is coming from.

The ELCA World Hunger program is making a difference around the world. Ending hunger is about more than just providing food; it is about providing a road to long-term sustainability and change. The ELCA is actively involved in connecting people with the resources they need to produce food and gain access to clean water and provide education, health care and sources of income to bring about long-term sustainability.

In 2017, ELCA World Hunger support topped \$21.3 million in aid. The ELCA World Hunger program is active in 62 countries in the world including the United States. Projects supported by the ELCA World Hunger program include:

- Establishing health clinics
- Providing micro loans
- Building water wells
- Establishing animal husbandry programs
- Providing community meals
- Establishing advocacy programs to influence country and local governments

The ELCA World Hunger program provides valuable assistance around the globe. This program depends on financial support from ELCA congregations like Holy Spirit. We can help support these efforts during this Lenten season. Matthew 25:35 states this best; "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in."

Foster Care Support

Thank you to all who attended the LCHS Coffee, Tea & Connect on **Foster Care Support** and have already provided support. Do you know what the primary reason is that children end up in foster care? It's not abuse. It's poverty. Poverty creates a situation where parents cannot adequately provide necessities for their children.

Maria Samaritano generously gives of her time to coordinate with the Lehigh and Northampton County case workers to help foster families as well as families at risk of losing their children to foster care. Maria works with the case workers and various individuals and organizations throughout the Lehigh Valley to collect items (new and gently used) to help families. She issues a detailed newsletter each week, typically on Thursdays, identifying the needs. You can sign-up to donate via a link to SignUpGenius in the newsletter. Maria coordinates with those donating to collect the items and deliver to the case workers. Depending upon the size of the items, Brenda Truhe is willing to collect the items at church and deliver to Maria.
