#### May is Mental Health Awareness Month.

There are hundreds of mental disorders. The most common include Anxiety, Depression, PTSD, Bipolar Disorder, Personality Disorders, and Obsessive-Compulsive

Disorder, to name a few, but the list of diagnosed disorders goes on and on. Fortunately, resources and help are available. Recognizing mental health issues and finding the courage to ask for help can be challenging. Lehigh County operates a Warm Line 24/7, which provides support and information about available services. The number is 1-833-899-1331. The Hot Line is for individuals in crisis who may pose a danger to themselves. Call 911 or the Lehigh County Crisis Intervention service at 610-782-3127; in Northampton County, call 610-252-9060, or to reach the national suicide hotline, call 988. Other local resources include the National Alliance on Mental Health (nami-lv.org), located at 802 West Broad St, Bethlehem, PA. 18018. Phone 610-882-2102. Both hospital networks, Lehigh Valley Health Network and St. Luke's University Network, offer behavioral health services. Additionally, there are numerous private counseling services throughout the Lehigh Valley.

If you believe you may have a mental illness, there is no need to endure the suffering and pain alone. If you suspect that someone you know is struggling with a mental illness, the best approach is to be patient, empathetic, and understanding while providing support and reassurance. Engage in an open, non-judgmental, gentle conversation with them. Such a discussion should come from the love and concern you have for this individual.



#### <u>Financial Results and Discussion - April 2025</u>

**Operating Performance:** April income was \$81,474, \$5,872 or 6.72% below budget. Operating expenses were \$75,728, \$8,240 or 9.81% below budget. We finished April with a \$5,746 surplus, compared to a budgeted surplus of \$3,378. The graph below presents our operating cash balance shown against our monthly cash requirement January - December.

Thank you to everyone that continues to share their financial gifts in support of our ministries!

- **Straight Line at \$120,000**: Represents our 6-week cash requirement to operate the church.
- **Upper Straight Line**: Represents our **current** operating cash balance at the end of each month.
- **Upper Dotted Line**: Represents our **projected** operating cash balance through year end.



**Building Fund:** The building fund increased \$515.00 during the month and has a balance of \$5,252.44.

**Mortgage Update:** The mortgage balance as of April 30, 2025 is \$353,792.42.

#### Global Refuge perseveres despite numerous challenges

You may have read that it's been **50 years since the fall of Saigon** during the Vietnam War which brought hundreds of thousands of Vietnamese refugees to the United States. This crisis marked a turning point for **Global Refuge** (previously known as Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service), **transforming the organization from a four-person team into a 100-member crisis-response organization**.

By the end of 1975, LIRS had overseen the resettlement of more than 15,000 Vietnamese refugees. That call helped to lay the foundation for the work Global Refuge continues today, offering welcome and refuge in the face of profound upheaval and chaos.

Refugees like those who arrived in the '70s from Vietnam are now friends, grandparents, neighbors, advocates, and integral members of their communities—and, in some cases, are paying it forward to support other refugee communities.

In those days, the federal government compassionately served as an integral partner in this humanitarian effort. Such is not the case in 2025.

During an online town hall meeting on April 30, CEO and president Krish O'Mara Vignarajah and other Global Refuge staff members detailed the many challenges the organization has faced since January 20.

Entitled "The First 100 Days: Our Work of Welcome Continues," the presentation identified the stark reality of the pause in refugee resettlement and the stop work order which has made it increasingly difficult to provide much-needed help for refugees Global Refuge was already serving.

President Vignarajah talked about the chilling lack of due process and the importance of finding ways to connect clients with state and local resources, including churches, as well as attracting grants from privately-funded programs and individual donors.

"We are NOT going anywhere," Krish stated. "We are not giving up. America is still the shining city on a hill and we intend to keep it that way."
