Global Refuge reacts to troubling Supreme Court decision

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's Global Refuge program has proudly helped over 800,000 refugees and immigrants build new lives in the United States since 1939.

On June 27, the Supreme Court made a decision which restricts the ability of lower federal courts to issue nationwide injunctions, effectively narrowing protections against an executive order that seeks to curtail birthright citizenships.

Krish O'Mara Vignarajah, President and CEO of Global Refuge, reacted immediately. She said, "Today's ruling opens the door to a dangerous patchwork of rights in this country, where a child's citizenship may now depend on the judicial district in which they're born. Continued next page. This is a deeply troubling moment not only for immigrant families, but for the legal uniformity that underpins our Constitution."

The decision stems from the Trump administration's Executive Order 14160, which attempts to restrict automatic U.S. citizenship for children born on American soil to <u>certain</u> immigrant parents.

While multiple lower courts had issued injunctions blocking the order from being enforced nationwide, the Supreme Court's ruling limits those injunctions to apply only to the named plaintiffs in each case, potentially leaving countless families exposed to legal uncertainty and statelessness. Importantly, the ruling <u>does not decide</u> whether President Trump's executive order itself is constitutional – a question that remains before the lower courts.

"Birthright citizenship has been settled constitutional law for more than a century," Vignarajah continued. "By denying lower courts the ability to enforce that right uniformly, the Court has invited chaos, inequality, and fear. This doesn't just disrupt lives. It undermines the very idea that the law should apply equally to all."

The immigrant and refugee families served by Global Refuge will now face differing legal realities depending on geography.

"We have already heard concern from families who are unsure whether their U.S.-born children will be recognized as citizens and who fear what might come next," said Vignarajah. "This fractured approach is unworkable, unjust, and out of step with our values as a nation."

Global Refuge will continue to monitor the legal and policy landscape, advocate for federal protections that apply equally to all, and support the rights and dignity of every child born in the United States.

Financial Results and Discussion – June 2025

Operating Performance: June income was \$58,594, \$13,067 or 18.23% below budget. Operating expenses were \$79,812, \$6,298 or 8.57% above budget. We finished June with a \$21,218 deficit,-compared to a budgeted deficit of \$1,853. The graph below presents our operating cash balance shown against our monthly cash requirement **April - December.**

- Straight Line at \$120,000: Represents our 6-week cash requirement to operate the church.
- Upper Straight Line: Represents our current operating cash balance at the end of each month.
- Upper Dotted Line: Represents our projected operating cash balance through year end.



Building Fund: The building fund increased \$785.00 during the month and has a balance of \$7,062.44.

Mortgage Update: The mortgage balance as of June 30, 2025, is \$351,704.66.
