Lectio Divina (Latin for "divine reading") is a traditional Christian practice of prayerfully reading scripture to expand one's communion with God and gain deeper spiritual insight. It's a slow, contemplative engagement with a biblical text, not merely an intellectual study. The goal is to move from reading the text to internalizing it as the living Word of God, allowing it to shape one's life. We will experience Lectio Divina together as a group, as well as learn ways to practice Lectio Divina individually.
