Neighborhood House

Neighborhood House (Sunday mornings) fills a current unhoused community need on Sunday mornings by providing breakfast and lunch and a safe place to get out of the cold or heat, in a location central to other outreach support for the unhoused community in Allentown, PA, November - April.

Volunteers known as "Hosts" are needed to: supply, prepare, and share gifts of a hot meal for breakfast and a bag lunch, and connect with Allentown, PA's unhoused community. Our goal is to serve the unhoused and build community among Allentown, PA congregations, other community groups, and individuals.

<u>HELP NEEDED!</u> We have signed up to serve Sunday breakfast at Christ Lutheran Church in Allentown on 3 dates: **December 7th**, **January 25th**, and March 1st.

At this time we are looking for 6 volunteers for the December 7th date.

We are also in need of food donations - approx. 8 hot breakfast foods - egg dishes, french toast, etc. prepared in a 13 x 9 disposable pan, along with individually wrapped muffins, fruit, and tuna in foil packets. Prepared dishes must be cooked/baked when they are delivered. There are sign-up sheets in the narthex for all of the food items.

Deb will be available at all services on Sunday, November 30th to sign you up. If one of our youth wishes to volunteer, they must be accompanied by a parent.

Sunday School Collection

During the month of December, Family Worship will be collecting the following items:

- Slim Jims
- Applesauce pouches
- Crackers with cheese (non-perishable)
- Capri-Sun juice pouches
- Fruit snacks
- Nut free granola bars such as Cliff bar for Kids

The Sunday school students will use these items to make snack bags for children in the Allentown School District. We are hoping to collect enough items to make 100 bags. The bags could be used to send home with children prior to an inclement weather day, shared with after school tutoring participants, or given to students whose families are experiencing homelessness.

Support Our Sisters

In the United States, we usually think of Advent and Christmas as a time of love and family, within a safe comfortable house. However, in our nation and world, December and January may be times when you are vulnerable, subject to abuse, and wondering where you might find a place of love and acceptance. We hope that in this season of Advent (waiting for a Savior to come), you consider the young women in Tanzania who are often marginalized by culture, tradition and systems that leave women voiceless. A faithful response is needed from us to help protect and educate women, give them life skills and enable them to become leaders.

Three organizations (which our global mission travelers visited in spring 2025) come to mind which can help deliver our faithful response:

• <u>MaaSae Girls Lutheran Secondary School</u> – a residential place of education for girls of secondary school age. The school offers sponsored year-round refuge for girls' education and development of life skills.

- <u>Empowered Girls</u> teaches life skills and health and uses fun activities to build confidence and equip them to take control of their lives and make good decisions.
- <u>Eripoto</u> dedicated to education, protection of women and girls (including sheltering victims of domestic violence), and advocacy for economic opportunities for young women.





Help us to take young women from poverty, forced marriage, and life at best as a teenage mother and family cook to a future where they live their dreams.

From November 30, 2025 through February 1, 2026, the Global Mission Team will be collecting donations to help organizations like Empowered Girls, Eripoto, and the MaaSAE Girls Lutheran Secondary School which provide safety, security, and education for young women in need of support.
