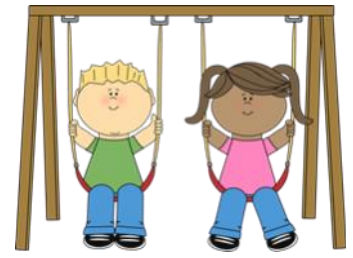

School Forms

- Emergency Form – Due by Sneak Peek

Please be sure to complete both sides of this form. The back side indicates who we may contact in regards to an emergency and who may pick up your child from preschool.

- Get to Know You Forms

Each teacher distributed get to know you forms in the Meet the Teacher mailing. Please complete these and bring them along to Sneak Peek. These forms help our staff get to know your child and best meet his/her needs during the transition to school.

- Medical Form – Due by Sept. 30th

The state of Pennsylvania requires that each child submit a medical form signed by their doctor that verifies that all necessary immunizations have been received (or a waiver signed) and any limitations regarding preschool participation.

- Photo and School Permission Slip

This form will be distributed at Sneak Peek. This lets us know your preferences regarding photo sharing and grants permission in case an emergency would occur at school.

School Supplies Needed

Each child should have a regular sized backpack and water bottle for school. The backpack should be large enough to hold a 9 x 12 folder. Snack can be sent in an individual container or a lunch box. A set of extra clothes to be kept at school should be sent in a gallon Ziploc bag. All items should be labeled.

Creating a Great Transition to School

- Come to “Sneak Peek”- Visiting or showing the child’s classroom to other family members reminds a child where they will be coming to school. Saying “Hello” to the teacher creates a memory of a friendly face as school approaches.
- Read a Story or Talk about Going to School- School talk and pretending about what will happen on that first day sets the expectation for the exciting day’s events.
- Put a Family Picture in Backpack- If you think your child might miss you on the first days of school, put a family picture in their backpack. Let the teacher know where to find it so she can have the child pull it out if needed. The teacher will reassure the child and remind them that the grown-up will pick them up at the end of the day.
- Arrival and Pick-Up- Arriving during the drop off time (8:55—9:05) provides a time to settle into the classroom and meet friends. Teachers will be greeting each child as they arrive. Good-byes, hugs, and a reminder about who is picking up at the end of the school day creates a relaxed routine. A prompt pick-up assures children that a grownup is there, just as promised. Clear and predictable routines provide comfort for young children.
- Tell A Story- After the first couple of days, assist your child in creating a story and telling others about how they went to Nursery School. What a wonderful story it will be!
